**136.1 Electronic Speed Sign and traffic on the A379:** APH reported that there was overwhelming support in Frogmore for a 20mph limit on the A379 through the village. JB reported that it was not currently DCC policy to use white lines in the road to indicate a virtual footpath (as has been done in West Charleton).

**143/20 COUNCILLOR REPORTS**

143.1 Stancombe Lane: NS reported that he had met the landowner on site with an SHDC representative to discuss the laying of hardcore on the path. It was clear that the material used, which allegedly had been certificated as free from contaminants, had prohibited content. The landowner would produce the certificates that had been supplied with and SHDC would now investigate. There was a feeling that the material should be removed and the track restored to its former state.

**143.2 COMMUNITY FUND DONATION KINGSBRIDGE AREA FOOD BANK**

It was resolved to donate £250 to the Kingsbridge Area Food Bank.

**144/20 PARISH PATHS PARTNERSHIP AND FOOTPATHS**

SH advised that the knotweed reported by the bus shelter was not of the aggressive variety and he had cut back vegetation on the path opposite the Frogmore village hall.

**145/20 TREE WARDEN**

SH reported that he had inspected the tree by Frogmore village and was of the opinion that it was unlikely to fall, it needed to be identified as an ash tree, in which case it might need to be felled anyway.

**146/20 SNOW WARDEN**

APH had offered to be snow warden for Frogmore. Two new bins were needed, one for snow and the other to store sand for sand bags. SB reported that the local community 'buddle hole busters' group had volunteered to help with sand bags when necessary.

**146/20 FROGMORE PHONE BOX**

Any funds raised from donations toward purchasing and installing the refurbished phone box could be paid into the parish council bank account.
